After dinner, the topic of our 40th reunion was raised. We then discussed that this time next year, as we were celebrating our 40th reunion, our nation would be recognizing the 10th anniversary of the beginning of the Global War on Terror. It would also mean that there would be young men and women still in harms' way, manning the ramparts so that we could enjoy our lives and our freedoms.

"Needless to say, the conversation became more subdued and serious at this point. What became clear was that to a person, graduate and spouse alike, we were committed to doing something 'productive' on this weeken - something that would recognize and support the sacrifices which these young men and women had made and continue to make for all of us. Regardless of when our troop participation ends in Iraq and Afghanistan, those warriors who deployed forward into harm's way on our behalf and had their lives and their family's lives altered forever, will need our financial and spiritual support for decades - we must ensure they are not forgotten. After identifying several charities which we could support, the **Injured Marine Semper Fi Fund** was selected as our charity of choice because the **Semper Fi Fund** supports the needs of our heroes and their families, regardless of service, at a time in which they are in real need of support. Additionally, every donation -- no matter if it is large, small, from corporations or from individual donors makes a real difference. Just as importantly, approximately \$0.92 of every \$1.00 raised goes directly to the heroes we desire to support!

"Once the charity was identified and since the majority of persons participating had type-A personalities, we discussed what our goal should be. After some initial conversation, we decided that this would be a decision for all of our 11th Companymates and began to solicit input from all over the country. After discussing an \$11,000 target (our Company), a \$40,000 target (our next anniversary) and a \$71,000 target (our

graduation year), we ultimately selected the \$71,000 target as our goal. Although we were not overly confident that we would achieve our goal, we collectively felt that it was best to 'go big'.

"Regardless of the event, the comment which was heard most often was how supportive all who became aware of our activity were for the noble cause supported by the **Semper Fi Fund**. This support came not only from the 11th Company-mates and their friends; it came from many different demographics - the young adults (20-40 year olds), the older veterans, the small town communities, the various business establishments across the country.

"The Class of 1971 / 11th Company / 40th Reunion Fundraiser officially concluded on April 6, 2012 when many 11th Company representatives presented Gen Al Gray (USMC, retired) who is the Chairman of the **Injured Marine Semper Fi Fund** a symbolic check in the amount of \$107,759!
