Allison of Dayton, Ohio and Katrena Allison Wells and her husband Tim of Mocksville; grandsons Caleb and Eli Wittum; granddaughters Hannah and Abigail Wells; sister Lou Ellen Campbell of Turners Falls, Mass.; a sister-in-law Audrey Allison of Key West, Fla.; and his fishing buddy Stacy Walser. He was preceded in death by his brother Homer Allison.
