Commander Frank L. Bessenger Jr., USN (Ret.), of Dade City, FL, passed away on Saturday, 7 October 2017. He was 78 years old.

Frank was born on 5 December 1938 in Dade City, the son of Leslie and Pearl Bessenger. He graduated from Pasco High School in 1956 and attended the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD, graduating in the Class of 1960.

As an active duty naval officer, Frank served 20 years with shipboard sea and shore assignments. He served three years as an advisor to the Iranian Navy in Tehran, Iran (1969-1972). His next assignment involved four years travel to Saudi Arabia from Washington, DC, on the OpNav project coordination effort for the FMS Saudi Naval Expansion Program.
