Major George C. Ross, USMC (Ret.), of Camp Hill, PA, died on 11 January 2003 at Holy Spirit Hospital after suffering major head trauma from a fall. He was 67 years old. He was born on 27 July 1935 in Chicago, IL, the son of the late William and Wilma Ross. Following a year at the University of South Carolina, he enlisted in the Navy. Two years later, he entered the Naval Academy with the Class of 1960. George was a four-year rock on the Battalion intramural football team. Surviving was his wife, Claire C. Ross; sons, Russell C. Ross of the home, and Kenneth E. Ross of Lemoyne, PA; daughters, Cindy L. Ross of the home, and Shari Ross Lahlou of Washington, DC; son-in-law, Med Lahlou of Washington, DC; and his brother, Dr. Marvin E. Ross of Carroilton, MO.

Services were held on 16 January 2003 at Grace Lutheran Church in Camp Hill, PA, with the Reverend B. Penrose Hoover officiating.
