



## Information Sheet for The 45<sup>th</sup> Reunion

- 1. Getting around
  - a. Security & Parking
    - 1) While you can drive onto the yard with a DoD ID card, parking is <u>extremely limited</u> due to extensive new construction: Cyber Building, Parking Garage, Rickover Hall renovation, and Santee Basin seawall replacement. You cannot drive between Alumni Hall/Nimitz Hall and College Creek—the road is closed. Construction equipment and Midshipmen parking take up what little remains. <u>Bottom line</u>: Recommend not driving onto the yard on Thursday or Friday. Saturday (Mid Store run) may be a little bit easier and Sunday might be okay, but keep in mind this is a Homecoming weekend for all classes. Take the Class buses if you can.
    - 2) <u>Suggestion</u>: If you must drive, consider using the City parking lot (accessible from Duke of Gloucester Street or Main Street) or park at the harbor area, and enter the Yard via one of the pedestrian entrances (either Barry Gate, located at the intersection of Prince George and Craig Streets behind Halsey Field House, or the entrance along Randall Street a few yards away from Gate 1). Both of these entrances lead you to Visitor security at the Field House.
    - 3) Security requires a DoD ID card or a driver's license. (Note: A separate email was sent re: those state driver's licenses that require second ID.)

### 5. Friday

- a. <u>1100-1200: Class Business Meeting</u> in Rickover 102. We'd like <u>all Classmates</u> to attend (so a \$372 "door prize" will be awarded to one lucky attendee in order to encourage participation.) Outgoing Class President Jim Grover will cover key accomplishments by the Class, and introduce incoming Class President Bob Leib. Jeff Beard will summarize our 50<sup>th</sup> legacy fundraising campaign, key goals, and which projects we'll support based on Class input via Survey Monkey. - b. 1350-1500 Superintendent's Welcome and Academy update talk in Mahan Hall.
- c. <u>1600-1700 Dress Parade</u> on "historic" Worden Field. There will be a Class seating section in the stands. Our Class '72 President, Jim Grover, will review the P-rade. Afterwards, expect a lot of people trying to catch buses at Alumni Hall trying to get back to the hotel (Homecoming Weekend).
- d. 1900-2330 Friday Dinner Reception at Loews. Tapas, Crab Dip, Pasta Bar, Carving Station, Butler-passed Hors D'Oeuvres, Desserts, Coffees/Teas... come hungry! There will be company tables with flags in several different rooms, so look for the signs. Due to the large number of attendees, while there may not be enough room for everyone to sit at company tables at the same time, there will be additional chairs for more seating, as needed. Everyone will get two free drink tickets at Reunion Registration/Check-In. Dress is business casual... Women: dress, skirt & dressy top, or dressy pants outfit... Men: slacks, dress shirt or casual button-down shirt, open-collar or polo shirt, no ties. Gluten free food will be available. (Please thank Dave and Barb Hogen for all their work in setting this up. ### 6. Saturday

- a. Tailgate will be in the N-Room at the stadium (see diagram). Access to the Tailgate is through the door off the stadium concourse only. You must enter the stadium to get into the Tailgate. (If you arrive before 1330, you will need to enter N-Room from Gate C with '72 Nametag. <u>EVERYONE NEEDS A FOOTBALL TICKET TO GET INTO THE STADIUM AND A REUNION NAMETAG TO GET INTO THE TAILGATE</u>. Football Tickets will be given out at check-in for registration, except for season ticket holders.
  - 1) Our tickets are for Section 1 and upper deck Section 101.
  - 2) Expect great food, seafood, crab-balls, beer, wine, through half-time.
  - 3) Dessert and Bar will be open until after Navy Blue and Gold.
  - 4) We can expand to the upper lever of the N-Room, if desired.
  - 5) Balfour Ring and Crest Reps will be at the tailgate 1330-1730 for buying and re-sizing (*Thanks Ginna Rubel for setting this up!*)
