I'm including a one-page summary of our campaign's status, as we now enter its third year. We should all consider this latest "participation" campaign as a "win-win" as we've had, in total, greater participation in this final campaign by our Class than in any previous campaign that we've ever run! We blew through the (what we thought) unrealistic goal of \$5 Million, and our totals now exceed \$6 Million (\$6.11 Million to be exact). THIS IS A RECORD - NO OTHER CLASS IN USNA HISTORY HAS RAISED THIS MUCH FOR A CAMPAIGN! My thanks to all of you (and especially our anonymous donor who set a "matching" goal of \$2.5 Million that we all met).
