Additionally, if you are interested in a tangible, visible and permanent way to pay tribute, you may want to look into one of the following options below:

Alumni Hall Honor Chair Program

The Honor Chair Program is a tangible way to remember and honor individuals upon a special occasion - or just in recognition of that individual. A \$1,000 gift to the Naval Academy Fund allows the permanent placement of an engraved brass plate on a seat in Alumni Hall, joining our 71 existing Class of '73 Honor Chairs. *Please note that matching gifts do not count towards the* \$1,000 gift for an Honor Chair.

Stadium Take-A-Seat Program

Max Bishop Baseball Stadium

With a gift of \$1,000 to the Baseball Excellence Fund, you can honor a classmate, loved one, or friend by "taking" a seat in Max Bishop Baseball Stadium. The honoree's name is inscribed on a plate permanently affixed to the seat; each plate permits four lines of text. Participation in the Take-A-Seat program helps to maintain the stadium and ensures that its legacy lives on for generations of graduates. You may name up to five seats in accordance with your gifts.

Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium

With a gift of \$1,000 to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium Maintenance Fund, you can honor a classmate, loved one, or friend by "taking" a seat in Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The honoree's name is inscribed on a plate permanently affixed to the seat; each plate permits four lines of text. Participation in the Take-A-Seat program helps to maintain the stadium and ensures that its legacy lives on for generations of graduates. You may name up to ten seats in accordance with the amount of your gifts.

Chapel Pew Program

The Chapel Pew Program is a meaningful way to remember and honor individuals at the time of a memorialization, class reunion, anniversary, or any other special occasion. A \$25,000 gift to the USNA Chapel Fund allows the permanent placement of an engraved brass plate on the inner aisle of a chapel pew, joining our Class of '73 pew and plaque. A gift of \$50,000 to the USNA Chapel Fund allows for the permanent placement of an engraved brass plate on both the inner and outer aisles, The text of the plate can include up to 4 lines with 26 characters per line.
