

Walter H. Porr, Jr., Esq. – Walt Porr received his undergraduate degree in history from the United States Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland in 1980. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps and served on active duty for five years, serving primarily as an Adjutant and Legal Officer. While on active duty he completed the Legal Officer's Course at the Naval Justice School in Newport, Rhode Island in 1982 and was the Honor Graduate in his class. He left active duty and earned his Juris Doctor (J.D.) from the George Mason University School of Law (now the Antonin Scalia Law School) in Arlington, Virginia in 1988, and his Masters of Law Degree (LL.M.) from Suffolk University Law School in Boston, Massachusetts in 2006. He was admitted to the State Bar of California in December of 1988. Since then, he has been admitted to the Bar of the United States Supreme Court; the First, Ninth and Eleventh Circuit Courts of Appeal; the Commonwealth of Massachusetts (January 2004); the State of New Hampshire (December 2012); the State of Rhode Island (May 2013); the State of Florida (November 2013); as well as in the federal District Courts in each of these states. He has been a trial and appellate attorney for the majority of his career, most significantly in municipal government settings. He served as an Assistant/Deputy City Attorney for the City of Bakersfield, California, for 12 years; as an Assistant City Solicitor for the City of Revere, Massachusetts, for nearly 2 years; and, as an Assistant Corporation Counsel for the City of Boston assigned to its Inspectional Services Department for 1 year. He and his wife, Susan, reside in Lake Worth, Florida. They have seven children.
