The following information is provided as a guide for your visit to the United States Naval Academy, Commissioning Week, 1980.

DRESS

Visitors should be prepared to cope with Maryland's unpredictable weather. During late May, temperatures vary from cold (in the 50's) to mid-summer hot, and rain showers are frequent.

Basically, three types of clothing are needed: casual outfits to include bathing suit, shorts, slacks, etc., for recreational outings; pantsuits, simple dresses or suits for spectator sports, parades or informal dinners; and formal dress for hops (long formals are usually worn and they are always worn for the King Dance and Farewell Ball). It is suggested in lieu of formal attire that parents wear their "dressiest best" for evening occasions.

Guests should bring a lightweight coat or jacket for evenings and a raincoat and an umbrella.

DINING FACILITIES

The Officers' & Faculty Club offers a luncheon sandwich bar and evening buffet dinners during Commissioning Week to midshipmen and their guests. The Drydock Restaurant in Dahlgren Hall offers fast food, sandwiches, etc. Information regarding local restaurants may be obtained from your midshipman host.

TRANSPORTATION

Transportation to Annapolis from Washington or Baltimore is limited to bus service. Airport limousines are available from Baltimore-Washington International Airport — taxis from National Airport, Washington, D.C.

HOUSING ACCOMMODATIONS

Overnight accommodations in the city of Annapolis are limited. It is suggested that you have either your midshipman host or the Midshipmen's Social Director assist you in obtaining reservations. The Social Director's office is located in the balcony area of Dahlgren Hall, U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland. Phone 301—267-2145, 267-2901.


SHIP VISIT

NOTES


