1. DIRECTIVE OF THE DAY. MID REGS ARTICLE 0617. PROPER PLANNING FOR LIBERTY AND LEAVE TRAVEL.

Travel plans shall provide for arrival in the Washington/Baltimore area twelve hours prior to leave expiration if travel originated outside the continental limits of the United States, or four hours if the leave or liberty was taken within the continental limits.
