Captain (Ret) **George "Goose" Siragusa** presented a check for \$107,670.36 to Byron Marchant, president of the USNA Foundation. Goose says, "That check, made up of ExxonMobil employee donations matched 3 to 1 under the company's Foundation Educational Grant Matching program, is part of over \$900,000 donated to the Naval Academy through the company program since 2005." This year's matching program funds are earmarked in part to the Science, Technology, Engineering and Match (STEM) camps run "in the yard" during the summer. Some of the relevant modules are Cyber issues, Robotics and Aquaculture Engineering—taught in part, by midshipman. "This kind of exposure to these disciplines helps underserved children make smart course choices in high school
